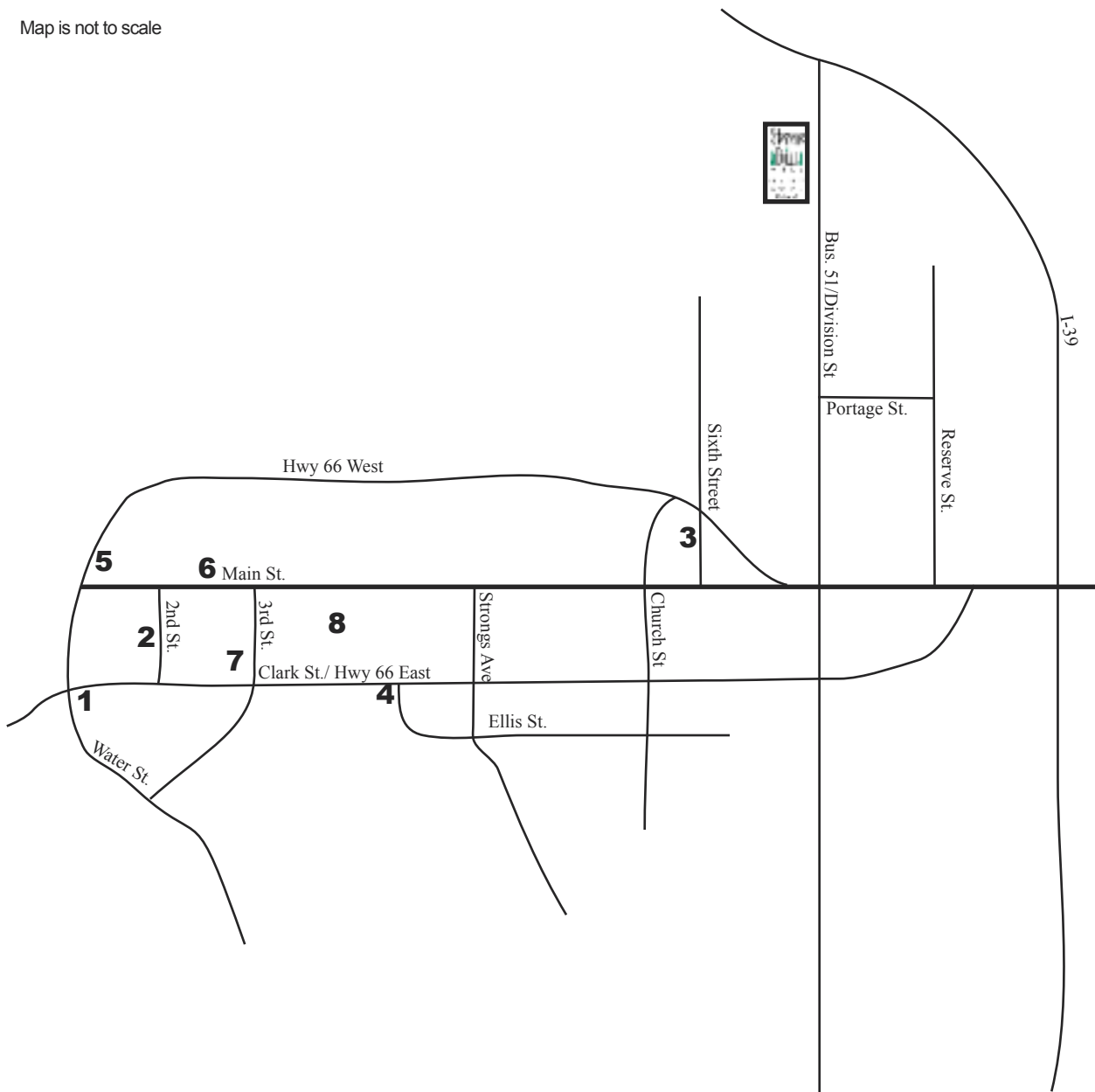

Stevens Point Murals

*Stevens Point History
brought to "still" life*

**A walking tour of the
Downtown Murals**

1 - The painting of the first of many Downtown Murals was completed in 2004. "Rivermen" was painted on the west wall of Van's Floor Covering located on the corner of Water and Clark Street. The mural depicts the early logging days on the Wisconsin River in Stevens Point.



5 - The fifth mural and second "Windows to the Past" mural, located on the Point Bakery Building depicts the 1947 celebration of the formal opening of the newer Point Bakery in the building which the mural is located on. pictured on the mural is the owner of the bakery Ted Zdrojewski and his two teenage daughters, who worked in the bakery with their father.



2-The second Stevens Point mural project was finished in September of 2006. The muralist, Kelly Meredith, started painting the mural on the north and west walls of Buffy's on the Square, downtown Stevens Point, in the Spring of 2006, and finished in the Fall just in time for the Annual "Dozynki" (Polish Thanksgiving) Harvest Fest. Find the names of the people on the "Market Square" mural.

6 - The sixth mural is the third of "Windows to the Past". These two murals are located on the West side of Graffiti on main street downtown.



3 - Our third mural project brings "The Old Post Office" back to life. The beautiful marble building originally stood on the corner of Strongs Ave. and Main St. but was torn down in the late 1960s. The mural, located on the east wall of the new Post Office building on the corner of Main St. and Smith St. downtown, was completed in July of 2008 by muralist Kelly Meredith. See the "Old Post Office" mural up close and see the names of the people in it.



7 - Located on the north wall of Cozy Kitchen, the longest running restaurant in Stevens Point, 1338 Third street, is called "Painting the Town". Over the years, thousands of "locals" and visitors enjoyed a fine home cooked meal at the Cozy. Speaking of locals, this mural was painted by local artist Greg Luedtke. Stop by to see the entire mural.



4 - The fourth mural and the first of the "Window to the Past" murals is located on the McDonald Law office-1059 Clark Street. The mural shows five generations of the McDonald family who have been involved in the land title business or legal profession for all five generations. It starts with Robert K. McDonald-1850's and ends with great-great granddaughter Sally K McDonald.

8 - This series of mini murals is located along the walk way on the east side of the Library. Take the stroll to see all of these murals pieces.
